Seeing just what detox and rehab looked like visiting my teenager helped me realize there could be a new horizon for myself as a parent. The question in my mind was presenting itself "How am I going to handle do as I say not as I do?" Upon returning from there my journey started, not knowing yet what AA had to offer. Talking to empty bottles in my kitchen cabinet after 4 or 5 days without a drink, wishing the bottles would not be filled again. I went to that log cabin looking building in Orleans where a friend in AA mentioned meetings take place. That day was a little over 3 years ago in March 2012. I went merely looking for a meeting list for someone else. Nervous and unsure what to expect, a handful of people were there a little before noon. I walked in, circled

the room maybe 3 times. I could not imagine what the room had to offer. Then it happened, I was greeted. He and I spent a few minutes talking then he said would you like to join us for the meeting in about 5 minutes? I agreed. I was curious to know what my teenager was talking about when he mentioned they went to AA meetings at the end of the day or AA commitments came to us meant. My journey began that day. I was willing to say "I am an alcoholic" and receive my 24 hour coin. It has been 3 years now, lots of meetings, reading AA literature daily and calling others. In my pocket I carry my coin every day.
